Our practical learning-focused curriculum starts with understanding the places where economic activity happens, then moves on to the logical foundations. Our lectures, focused on practical subjects, are delivered by professors with abundant work experience from backgrounds as diverse as academia, business, and government.

We've prepared a wide variety of subjects to serve as a starting point for learning about economics

We offer a wide spectrum of subjects related to economics. By starting out with areas that grab their attention, students can get involved and interested in economics, allowing them to learn deeply about a variety of subjects.

Creating members of society who possess diverse knowledge concerning Japanese cultures, strong Japanese language ability, and an international viewpoint

A varied teaching team knowledgeable about many specialized fields
Our teaching team is well-versed primarily in the diverse fields of Japanese thought, culture, society, film, religion, and popular culture, and will carefully lead students from the absolute basics through highly deep subjects.

Unique lectures approaching the true nature of Japanese culture from a number of angles
In order to dig deep and search for the special aspects of Japanese culture, we offer well-prepared and unique lectures that touch on many facets of Japanese culture, including film, entertainment, publishing, music, mass media, and more.

Support for career development, including teaching, curating, and library services, in order to match individual students' needs
Students can obtain a number of qualifications, including teaching in Japanese, sociology, geography and history, or calligraphy, as well as museum curating or library studies. In addition, roads to many other careers are open, like publishing or mass media.

Department of History

Cultivating members of society who can examine societal trends historically and logically, and make overall judgments

Learn about every one of five courses, and gain a wide-ranging perspective
After learning the basics of each course (Japanese, Eastern Studies, Western Studies, Archaeology, Geology, and Art History/Cultural Heritage), students can choose the course they are most interested in from the six courses. Students will be able to explore history from a wide-ranging perspective.

We advance research using a combination of educational techniques such as lectures, exercises, readings of historical texts, and more
Students will research various ages from historical and logical perspectives using combinations of lectures, exercises, historical readings, etc., divided by course. Students will be able to learn deeply about specialized areas.

Providing unique subjects to match students' interests
We have numerous subjects available to respond to the needs of various ages of history, including local history, paleography, art history, women's history, and family histories. Each student will be able to heighten their level of interest.

Department of Sociology

We aspire to cultivate character, employability, and wide-ranging knowledge of sociology, culture, and humanity.

Students will learn the core logic and research techniques for analyzing modern society
We've created a curriculum allowing students to acquire the core logic and research techniques for analyzing society, culture, and humanity of the world today. Our goal is a comprehensive education in the liberal arts as well as specialized fields.

Acquiring highly specialized knowledge and searching for a way to solve social problems
We provide specialized electives in three areas: general sociology, media and communication, and human coexistence and public life. Students will learn specialized knowledge allowing them to identify real-world problems in society and solve them.

Improving character and working to gain the ability and skills needed for life in society
We aspire to give students more of the practical characteristics and employability required for life in society through practical education provided by comprehensive exercises and subjects on career education, as well as four years of classes with high teacher-student ratios.

Department of Psychology

An opportunity to learn the basics of psychology and specialized subjects such as clinical psychology at the same time in a balanced way

We offer a wide variety of subjects focusing on psychology and also covering related areas
We offer a diverse array of subjects ranging from psychology to related topics, allowing students to study a wide range of fields with our faculty's specialized instruction. In addition, students can become a Certified Psychologist under the auspices of The Japanese Psychological Association.

Three courses allowing learning through focusing on specialized areas
In the third year and above, students join one of the three courses, Basic, Developmental and Social Psychology, to pursue their own specialized studies.

Fully outfitted experimental and practice facilities to support independent learning
Complete facilities and laboratories, including a behavioral development observation room with a monitor room attached, are available. By using these for a variety of experiments, exercises, and seminars, students will be able to build up practical training experience.

Department of Language Studies

Deepening understanding of other cultures as well as creating professionals who can thrive on the world stage and who possess both language ability and communication ability

Students will learn according to their ability, and in four years they will master a foreign language as their "specialty language"
Students select one language from among English, German, French, Spanish, Chinese, or Korean when they take their test. Over four years, they will make it their "specialty language" and learn it in a systematic manner.

Starting in the first year, students will learn an "elective language" and cultivate an ability to use multiple languages
Students may freely choose and study elective languages beginning in the first year from among eight languages (English, German, French, Spanish, Chinese, Korean, Italian, and Russian).

Transmitting and interactive coursework where students can voluntarily participate
Both of the language course and the seminar have a system in which each class has the limited number of students, about 20. The aim of this system is to place a focus on communication with students so that they can acquire knowledge on a steady basis while determining their levels of understanding.

Curriculum Features
Based on our principle to encourage students to learn linguistics together with culture, students in each course learn "Languages and Cultures of the World I and II" as compulsory subjects. They are also required to take the "preseminar" class in their second year and "seminar" in their third. In their fourth year, they are to choose between "graduation thesis / production" or "graduation seminar." This curriculum allows students to enhance their expertise by clarifying fields that interest them and becoming aware of problems.

Department of Education and Culture

Creating professionals who take part of in many facets of education, as middle school and high school teachers, as government employees, in corporate jobs related to education, and more

Supporting a variety of paths forward - not only becoming a teacher, but working at a company or becoming a government employee

From the first year, students will study the basics of education and being a teacher. Following this, they will be able to study a diverse array of subjects with an eye towards post-graduation, including becoming a teacher, working at a continuing education center, becoming a government employee, or getting involved in an education-related position at a company.

Learning to think in a way that allows students use wide-ranging knowledge

Students will learn how to use their knowledge in a way that allows them to accumulate and use knowledge outside their specialty through learning that requires them to independently find and solve educational problems. This ability will be useful even outside the path to being a teacher.

A program allowing students to experience teaching on-site and boost their practical skills

Even from the first year, we allow students to experience education on-site. From the third year, we employ practical instruction that emphasizes school internships and volunteer work, so students will be ready to contribute to their workplaces immediately after graduation.

Systems and Management in Education (Junior/High School)

With regards to the ideal "school" within a region, we will primarily analyze methods for linking a school with local society, and the possibilities and issues entailed. In addition, students will deepen their understanding of creation of classes which school support volunteers take part in, as well as recent educational reforms regarding school management, thus learning about the way schools and local society should be linked.

Elementary Education Course

A diverse curriculum combining theory and practice

In order to cultivate future elementary and preschool teachers who have a high degree of specialty and practical ability, we have a wide variety of lecture subjects allowing students to learn education theory and get real-world educational experience on-site at the same time.

Students can obtain qualifications in addition to the teacher's license

Students can become qualified for jobs such as a special support school teacher or teacher-librarian. With elementary education as the central axis, they will be able to learn about a wide range of subjects, such as educational psychology.

Learning using experience gained through practical exercises at our various affiliated schools

We provide students with the opportunity to work with children throughout their four years of study through options like teaching at Teikyo University Elementary School and volunteer activities. With our practical on-site instruction beginning soon after studies begin, students will quickly become proficient.

We provide the foundations for future preschool teachers with on-site learning with children

Preschool Education Course

A diverse curriculum allowing students to gain a high level of specialization

With the learning required for obtaining qualifications at its core, our high-quality curriculum also allows study of a wide-range of subjects such as education and psychology. By freely selecting and studying these subjects, students can gain a high level of specialization.

Refining practical skills through on-site teaching exercise experience

From the first year, students will be participating in volunteer activities at Teikyo University Kindergarten, regional day care centers, preschools, and welfare facilities. Through exercises emphasizing on-site experiences, students will become capable professionals.

Raising the level of future educators by linking theory and practice

In order to mold preschool teachers and childcare professionals with high degrees of specialization and practical ability, we provide learning that links together childcare theories with on-site experience. Students will gain stronger footing as educators.

Faculty of Science and Engineering

Work on issues and problems involving human survival, such as global environment and energy.

We offer a special entrance exam for international students

Faculty of Medical Technology

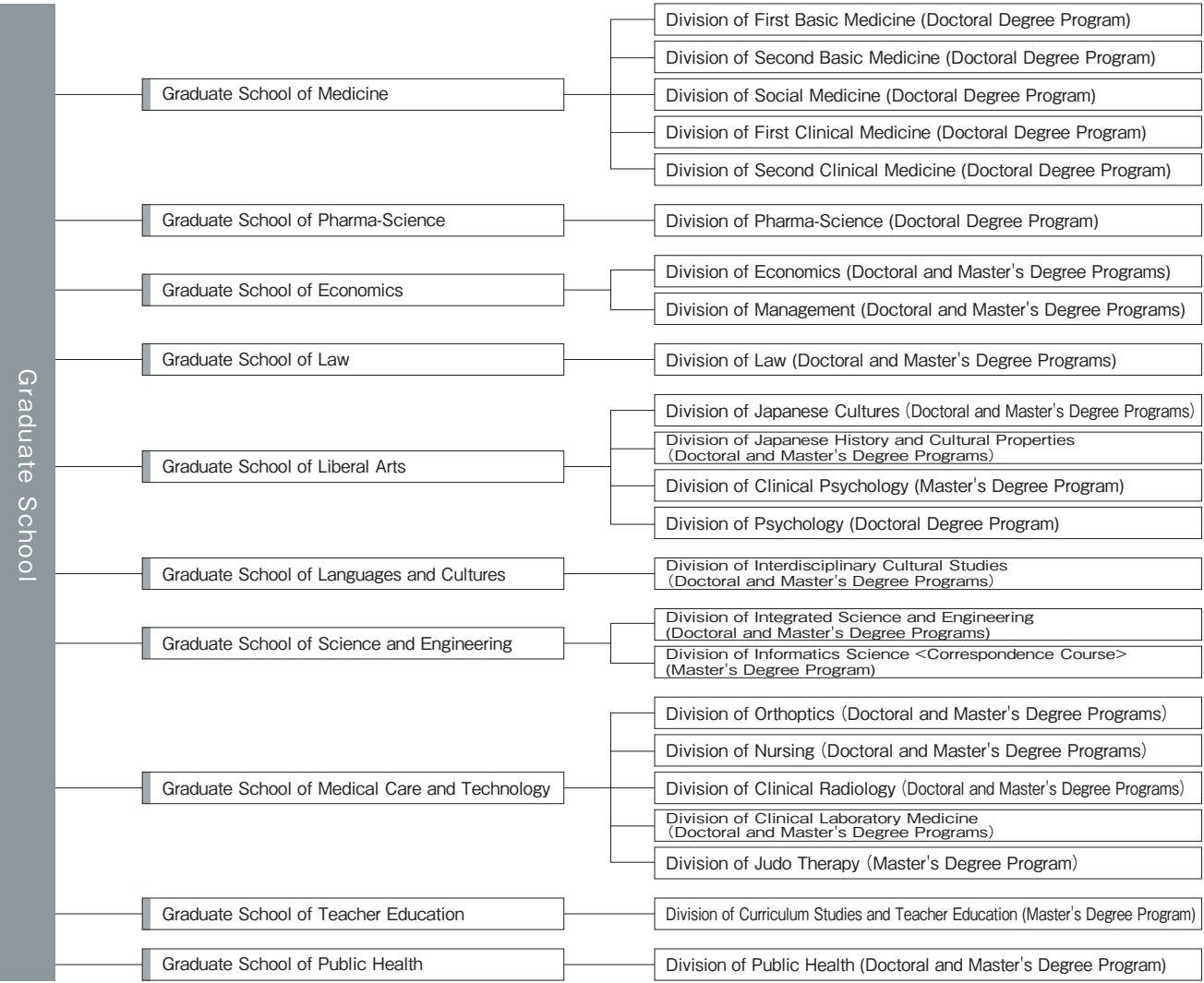

Center for Global Education was established to meet various challenges created by the mounting tide of globalization and the promotion of internationalism within the Japanese educational circles. The Center offers preparatory courses for Japanese as a foreign language, Counseling Department and Purser Department, with its functions including the conclusion of agreements with foreign universities, with respect to accepting international students and sending Japanese students abroad to study. At present, approximately 400 international students study at Teikyo University and Teikyo Junior College combined whereby one will have opportunities to be exposed to various foreign languages and cultures by simply being on a Teikyo campus.

Assistance for obtaining the Certificate of Eligibility for Residence Status (VISA)

With respect to international students living abroad who have completed the admission procedure, we offer instructions to prepare the required documentations to apply for VISA. Additionally, after all the documentations have been received from students, T-SAC will submit their applications on your behalf.

Housing Placement Service

Students who have obtained the Certificate of Eligibility for Residence Status (VISA) need to secure a place to live after being admitted to the school prior to coming to Japan. When renting an apartment in Japan, a guarantor is required to co-sign the lease but we have special arrangements with some major housing rental agencies whereby we will assume the role of guarantor for certain properties specified by us to facilitate the lease agreement process for our students.



Post-Admission Student Support Services:

Guidance for International Students

Guidance Counseling is available to international students to teach the school regulations and to offer guidance in relation to studying and living in Japan. If you have any concerns or problems with study, college life and other related issues, come in and talk to us anytime at the reception at T-SAC. We are here to help you.

Special Classes for International Students

After being admitted to the faculty, if you are not comfortable with Japanese or if you have concerns about your life on campus, we offer a full support structure. With respect to the subjects such as English, Modern English and Practical English, these courses are offered with contents gearing towards international students and, as alternate subjects, Japanese I through IV are offered with several classes being available for each level. Both Life Design Exercise (prerequisite) and Japanese Expressions (prerequisite elective) gearing toward international students are also offered in several classes.

Issuance of commuter ID and other identification

Necessary identification documents will be issued when purchasing a student commuter pass.

Assistance with renewing/changing residence status

The student visa must be renewed for each period of stay. We will help draw up and prepare the necessary documents, which may differ depending on an individual's circumstances. Please consult with T-SAC if you have any questions.

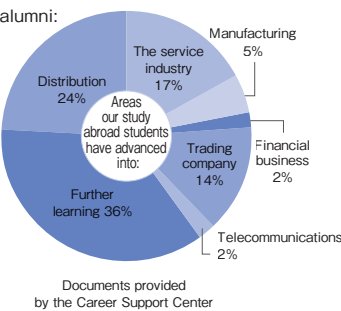

Career Support Center (CSC)

Point 1

He takes lunch with his friends at the Center for Global Education.



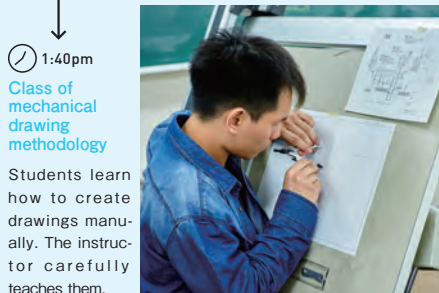
11:00am **Class of thermodynamics**

Q What is your favorite subject?

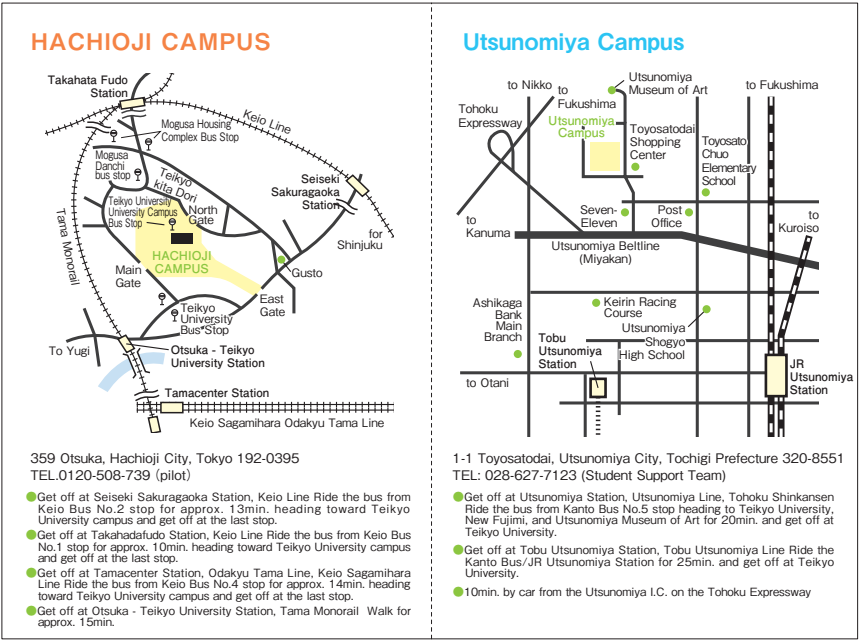
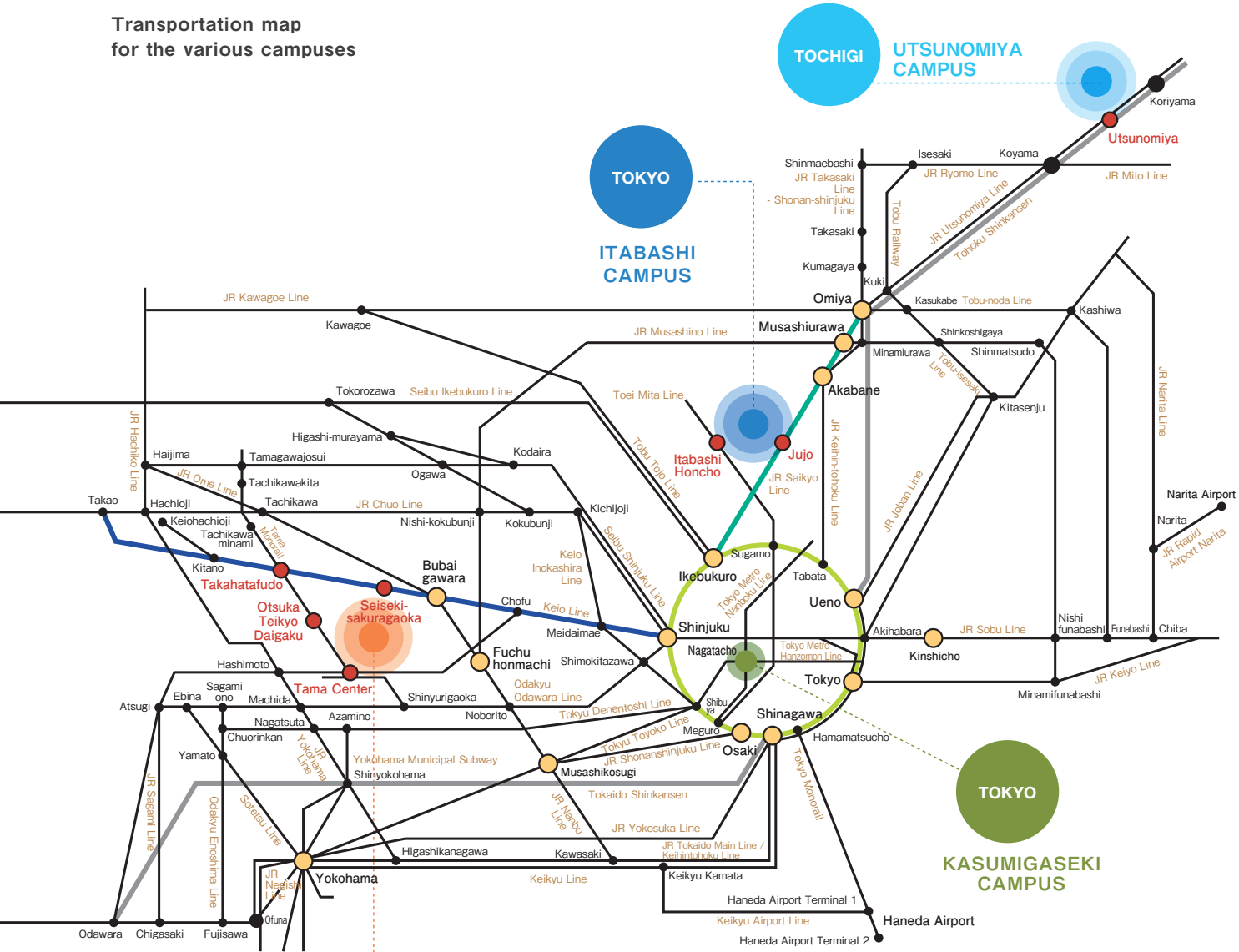
